## **ABSTRACTS**

We would like to encourage Conference delegates to submit an abstract for presentation at the forthcoming annual meeting. All presentations will take place on Thursday 15 September 2005.

**The deadline for submission of abstracts is Friday 8 April 2005.**

There are four modes of presentation:

- **The BSPD Young Researchers' Prize,**

This competition is open to BSPD members, where the principal researcher is within 15 years of initial professional qualification. The research presented must be original, be in the field of Paediatric Dentistry and have been completed within the last 18 months. Submitted abstracts will be considered by a panel of judges, led by the BSPD President. A short list of finalists will be asked to present their work. Participants will be allowed 10 minutes for an oral presentation followed by 5 minutes for questions. A panel of judges will decide upon a winner to be announced at the Conference Dinner.

- **Poster Presentation**

Delegates are invited to present their work as a poster, maximum size 2m x 1.3m portrait. These will be displayed on a standard display board throughout the day. Participants will be asked to attend their poster for one hour in order to answer informal questions from other delegates.

- **BSPD Poster Prize**

BSPD members are invited to present their work as a poster as above, but if wishing to enter for the Poster Prize are required to give a 3 minute formal oral presentation followed by a 2 minute question session. The presentation may be supported by one PowerPoint slide. A panel of judges will decide upon a winner to be announced at the Conference Dinner.

- **Clinical Case Presentation Prize, sponsored by RA Medical**

BSPD members, especially trainees and specialists in Paediatric Dentistry are invited to present interesting case studies. Clinical cases should demonstrate complex, novel or multidisciplinary treatments provided for a child and should satisfy one or more of the following criteria:

- Involve any advanced restorative, prosthetic, periodontal, surgical or orthodontic treatments
- Involve a multidisciplinary input to treatment planning and provision of care
- Involve short, and ideally long term management of complex trauma cases
- Involve short, and ideally long care management of patients with dental anomalies
- Involve comprehensive treatment provision of patients with significant medical histories
- Involve diagnostic and treatment approaches for patients presenting with rare or unusual pathology.

Presenters will be required to give a 10 minute oral presentation. This will be followed by 5 minutes for questions and discussion. A panel of judges will decide upon a winner to be announced at the Conference Dinner.

**Presenters will be sent further information regarding their presentation arrangements upon acceptance of their abstract.**
